














Carmel Public Library Foundation's Distinguished Honoree of the Year: Valera Lyles

Library Foundation Honoree.



An Extraordinary Gift from Donald Basil High

Carmel Public Library Foundation is honored to be a beneficiary in the bequest of longtime local and library patron, Donald Basil High.

Donald Basil High was born on September 5, 1921 in East Preston, England, and was educated at St. Andrews School in Worthington, Sussex, England. He immigrated to Los Angeles in 1957 where he worked as an Architect for the major movie studios including Twentieth Century Fox and Warner Brothers in Los Angeles. He met his wife Mildred Mary Hardy at an English/Irish Social Event in Southern California. They were married on November 4, 1966 in Santa Monica, CA. Don received his United States Citizenship on February 13, 1970. Don and Mildred purchased their home in Carmel in the 1980's. They enjoyed traveling, exploring the Central Coast and living a quiet life in Carmel-by-the-Sea. Mildred died on February 27, 1999.



Donald Basil High September 5, 1921-August 19, 2021

Don was a daily walker on Scenic Road in Carmel, loved the Harrison Memorial Library in Carmel where he caught up on current events, and enjoyed gardening at his home.

Don will be greatly missed by his wide group of fellow walkers in Carmel, his friends at the Harrison Memorial Library, and many friends throughout the Community.

Don passed away on August 19th, just 3 weeks prior to what would have been his 100th birthday. In remembrance of Don, there was an informal walk on Scenic Road in Carmel and a gathering in the Garden in front of the Harrison Memorial Library.




