In an era marked by rapid technological advancements and the digitization of information, libraries continue to stand as bastions of knowledge, offering vast book collections, technological

This program is part of the Henry Meade Williams Local History Lecture Series and will be in collaboration with AIA Monterey Bay.

We hope you attend one or all of our programs either in person or online and continue to utilize our library as a place of inspiration with an atmosphere conducive to reading, research and contemplation – a place for personal growth and community connectivity, where we come together to learn, interact, and engage.






