
I hope you will join us for these incredible programs during the rest of the year. This year's 11th annual Carmel Public Library



### **TARA WESTOVER** is an American memoirist, essayist and historian.

- Her memoir Educated published in 2018 debuted at No.1 on The New York Times bestseller list, stayed on the bestselling list in hardcover for over 2 years and was translated into 45 languages.
- The book was voted the No. 1 Library Reads pick by American librarians.
- Educated has sold more than 8 million copies.

Born in Idaho to a father opposed to public education, she never attended school. An older brother taught her to read, and most of her days were spent working in her father's junkyard or stewing herbs for her mother. She was seventeen the first time she set foot in a classroom. After that her first encounter with education she pursued learning for a decade, graduating magna cum laude from Brigham Young University in 2008 and subsequently winning a Gates Cambridge Scholarship. She received an MPhil from Trinity College, Cambridge in 2009 and in 2014 was awarded a PhD in history. In 2018, she published her memoir, Educated, which explores her struggle to reconcile her desire for education and autonomy with her desire to be loyal to her family.

leader in many other organizations in our community and always made time to see me and "noodle" on all things library. Leslie was my mentor and friend.

Her talent for cultivating relationships and creating impactful exchanges led to Carmel Public Library Foundation's positive trajectory and current success. Leslie's presence is still felt by those who knew her through her foundation work and of course through all of her friendships and family ties. Leslie and I would lunch every few months, and whenever I had or wanted an idea for a speaker or a program, or to discuss current events or some philosophical epiphany, it was Leslie's number I called. Leslie's passion to inspire continues through her Sterling Circle legacy membership with the Carmel Pubic Library Foundation. She was a lifelong learner who embodied a unique positivity and thirst for knowledge that kept her searching and engaged.

I miss seeing Leslie – at our annual events, monthly programs, coming out of the Crossroads dry cleaners, having lunch at Rio Grill, on my Scenic walks, etc. I keep expecting to see her around the corner. I suppose it isn't surprising to still feel the presence of someone who touched so many lives and was responsible for shaping so many of Carmel's literary and cultural endeavors. Thank you, Leslie.
