

Building Bonds



This year's CPLF community library programs contemplate architecture, design and a sense of place. They explore the importance of our physical environment and how it affects our emotional well-being. At November's program, cultural architect and Oakland's first Poet Laureate Dr. Ayodele

Nzinga, shared her poems and thoughts about the importance of place and how feelings of belonging and impermanence shape our perspectives. **When Brains Meet Buildings** author, Dr. Michael A. Arbib, revealed the relationship between neuroscience and architecture – how we cognitively process the built environment. He introduced the concept of "waylosing" as the result of a design element meant to encourage spontaneous exploration and curiosity – often used in libraries.

Our library grounds our community through its physical presence in the unique village of Carmel-by-the-Sea. It also serves as a place that holds our cultural memory while providing an atmosphere of significant meaning for all of those who interact with it. The materials that flow in and out, like its visitors are part of a continual circulation of thoughts, ideas and experiences that advance knowledge and keep us connected.

This spring's annual CPLF fundraiser, **The HUMAN Edition,** *Essential Observations in the Accelerated Age of Everything* with Douglas
Brinkley and Dave Eggers, is in some ways a

In addition to providing your ongoing library services and programs, the



The most outstanding contribution to children's literature this year was awarded to Dave Eggers for his new all-ages novel, *The Eyes and the Impossible*.


